THE SALINE COUNTY QUILT TRAIL

The Arkansas Quilt Trail is expanding to Saline County. What is a quilt trail you might ask? A quilt trail is a series of barn quilts placed along a route, which has been started in many communities as an avenue for drawing tourism and celebrating the local heritage. A **barn quilt** is a large piece of wood that is painted to look like a quilt block and is hung on a barn, garden shed, house, business, church, etc. The blocks range from 4×4 ft to 8×8 ft, and each block has a story telling either the origin of the pattern, or the historical information about the place it is located.

The Saline County quilt trail is in its early stages and currently has two approved quilt blocks. In order to have the quilt trail be deemed official, Saline County must have 12 approved quilt blocks made and on display. To have a block added to the county trail, the following guidelines need to be followed.

- To avoid duplicates, block designs must be submitted to the Saline County Coordinator for approval.
- The block needs to be easily visible from the road and road accessible to allow picture taking.

Once the Saline County Quilt Trail is established with 12 blocks, the county trail is added to the Arkansas Quilt Trails website (<u>www.arkansasquiltrails.com</u>) and to promotional materials. There is also a Facebook page for the Arkansas Quilt Trails. You can also read a recent article written about Arkansas' quilt trails in the Arkansas Living Magazine (<u>www.arkansaslivingmagazine.com</u>)

Arkansas Quilt Trails Coordinator Renee Carr, said, "I knew Arkansas was a perfect place to develop quilt trails. It's an especially appropriate way to spotlight our rural communities and bring in more visitors. We have beautiful roadways to travel, interesting stories to share, talented people, a quilting heritage, and some terrific volunteers to make it happen.

Currently, there are established quilt trails in Stone, Searcy, Van Buren, Perry, and Baxter Counties. Quilt trails are being developed in Newton, Pike, Boone, Cleburne, Yell, Sebastian, Craighead, Washington, Montgomery, and Saline County.

In addition, this would be a great community project for a youth group, 4H club, art club, etc., to participate in.
