~ Meeting Minutes ~

The Saline County Quilters' Guild Calvary Baptist Church, 612 Valley View Road, Benton, Arkansas January 20, 2020

5:30 Workshops: Fay Poe presented a tutorial on how to make a Just Strip It block. Fay advised that more information can be found on Sewing with Nancy—Season 20 Episode 22 - *Every Last Piece*. Also, in Judy Martin's Scrappy Log Cabin book.

Joyce Opitz, President for 2020, called the meeting to order at 5:50 p.m. Sondra Curtis introduced Joyce to the members.

Joyce brought attention to the 4 tables that had cookie plates the center. Members were instructed to check under their chairs for a winning number. The person with the winning number won not only the cookie plate, but the opportunity to organize one program for the guild in 2020. Other members at the table would be her team to help with the program. Joyce had a list of 15 ideas for them to choose from. The winners of the cookie plates were Carol Smith, Norma Welch, Judy Peters, and Shirley Miller.

<u>Treasurer Reports:</u> Pat Wade presented the report and it stands as presented.

Secretary Minutes: Joyce Opitz asked if there were any corrections or additions to the November 18, 2019 meeting minutes as printed in the newsletter. There were none and the meeting minutes were approved as printed.

<u>Committee Chairpersons Reports:</u> as called for by Joyce Opitz.

Quilt Show Planning:

• Gwen Rogers informed the members that there are lots of opportunities to help with Quilt Show planning. This is a big job and if you have a

strength that you think would help make it easier, please contact Gwen.

- Gwen has given Joyce a proposed budget for Quilt Show 2020 based on the 2018 show actual.
- Fay Poe presented samples of show ribbons.
 Decision was made to go with Grandma's Flower Garden style ribbons.
- Myrna Yandell asked members to start work on door prizes. If you are making something think about making an extra one for a door prize.
- Shirley Miller reminded members that she is collecting small quilts / wall hangings to be in silent auctions with \$20 as a starting price. The goal is to have a minimum of 50 for auction.

First Wednesday: Sondra Curtis explained how this works. It is held the 1st Wednesday of each month usually 9:30 through lunchtime. A member usually hosts in their home and there are usually around 12 attendees who bring handwork and sew and visit. Judy Huggins added that some members host this at the Calvary Baptist Church when room is available, also Shellie Blake hosts at her business, The Bed Warmer Quilt and Sew. Host has a choice to serve food, choose to do a pot luck, or brown bag it.

Library: Myrna Yandell reminded the members that available books are listed on the website and the list is being updated.

Name Tags: Joyce Opitz will continue ordering name tags. Orders will be placed three times a year. Please see Joyce if you are in need of one.

Donation Quilt: Paulette Hutchings reported that the donor quilt is going slow but is being worked on.

Membership Report: Shirley Miller said one new member was in attendance, Jeannie Huffman. Jeannie gave the group a brief bio on herself. Shirley reminded the group that she was still collecting dues for the 2020 year.

Charity Quilts: Sidney Morris and Myrna Yandell reported on quilts delivered — 36 Arkansas Children's Hospital, 3 Quilts of Valor, 5 Foster Care Malvern, 2 Breath of Life, 1 DAV, 6 Safe Haven, 10 Civitan, 5 New Beginnings, 8 Hospice, 1 Twyla

Moore's mother, 6 Soaring Wings Ranch, and 34 Human Society. This group meets on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month at Sidney's workshop located in the old Alcoa credit union building. Everyone is welcome. Kits are available to take home and complete. This is a good place to get questions answered or help with projects.

Woolie Chicks: Gwen Rogers said this group meets the 2nd Monday of each month. The February 10th meeting will be held arriving after 9:30 AM at Gwen's home, bring a brown bag lunch. Gwen has an abundance of wool, if you are interested in some wool, please contact her.

Daytime Stitchers: Gwen Rogers, for Jean Corley, reported that Daytime Stitchers will meet on Monday, January 27th at Johnston's. Doors open at 9:30 AM. Gwen will present a tutorial of her choice at 10 AM. Bring something for show and tell. There will be a discount for attendees.

Quilts of Valor: Kris Boulton said this group meets the 4th Wednesday of each month at Johnston's Home Center from 9:30 AM to Noon. Since June 2019 they have finished 27 quilts.

QuiltMania:

- Pat Wade reminded members that this will be held April 6-9, 2020. Pat distributed 2020 QuiltMania Registration Forms to those interested. This registration form includes sign up for classes, lodging, daily drop-ins and fees for each. See Pat if you need a registration form or you have questions.
- Myrna Yandell is heading up the kitchen.
- Linda Beavert and Paulette Hutchings are working on the classes.
- Fay Poe is teaching a class on the Aunt Betty's Attic pattern. If interested, pay the \$10 fee to Fay and receive your supply list.
- Twyla Moore is collecting door prizes and goodies for 50 bags that go to the first 50 paid registrations.
- Shelia Bird is overseeing this year's QuiltMania Challenge.

Fund Raising:

- Judy Peters reminded members that RADA sales will be ongoing and catalogs are available. Saline County Quilters' Guild receives 40% of sales. Payment is required at the time of your order.
- Judy proposed a challenge to the members to reuse, reinvent, or rescue an item of their choice. Judy explained this challenge and showed examples. The challenge begins now and is due at the April meeting which is during Earth Day week. More on this at the February meeting.

Old Business: No old business to be discussed.

New Business: Joyce Opitz informed the members that the Saline County Quilters' Guild Board had discussed joining the Benton Chamber of Commerce. This comes after speaking with an area banker who suggested it might be advantageous to the Guild for exposure and advertising. A motion was made for the Guild to join the Benton Chamber of Commerce, the motion was seconded, motion was then voted on and passed with all in favor.

Program: Joyce introduced Carole Roberts who spoke on Iced Dyed Fabrics. Carole walked the members through the process while sharing tips and where to purchase supplies. Members were interested in hearing the steps in this process and enjoyed the opportunity to see, touch and purchase some of Carole's beautiful work.
