New Business

Motions to cancel the Saturday Sew Day, July 24th was passed. Daytime Stitchers & 1st Wednesday were also cancelled due to the escalating COVID-19 numbers. Shirley will ask Eddie to send an email to all members about the cancelations.

Publicity – A publicity chairman is needed. We need more publicity about our guild and need to expand to include more of an online presence.

<u>July Program</u> – Charlotte Williams, owner of Pinwheels

Why you should have your machine professionally cleaned regularly.

Charlotte discussed differences between the machines of yesteryear and today's electronic machines. The all-metal machines of olden days had one motor compared to the electronic machines that may have up to 7 "step-up" motors. Where the old machines could be totally taken apart, cleaned and reassembled by the owner; the new electronic machines really need to be professionally cleaned generally once a year, more or less depending on your use. Professional cleaning costs between \$80 - \$200 depending on the machine and the issues it has.

There are habits that you can adopt that will help the machine operate better. Some of the items she discussed:

- Follow the maintenance recommendations in the manual for your machine. If you do not have a manual, they are all available online; do not pay for one, there are free copies available.
- Never use WD-40 or 3in1 oil on your machine.
 Only oil if you have a front-loading bobbin case! Use 1 drop with each bobbin change.
 This is especially important for long arm machines.
- Change your needle! How often? Every 8-10 hours of sewing or rule of thumb every 3 bobbins
- If needle threader will not thread after two tries, change needle. Most needle threader issues are because of the needle.
- All thread is not equal. Use quality thread, some fuzzes more than others.
- Clean the lint out of the bobbin area regularly
- Uneven wound bobbins will wear out the machine

 When you are close to the end of the bobbin, change it; do not keep trying to get to the very end of the thread. Getting to the end of that thread where it may have a loop from where it was held to wind, will cause a jerk to your machine causing damage.

Charlotte emphasized that she has been sewing and working on machines a very long time and has been guilty of all these things! Don't feel bad if you are guilty (everyone has done some of these!), but some new practices might keep you and your machine happier.

Show and Tell – Members displayed some of their recent works of art!

Mystery Quilt 2021 Step 3


Cut Scrappy Borders: from your dark/medium cut the following in lengths from 8" to 22" in width given below. (do not cut WOF) Label and set aside to be used in later steps

- A) 2 1/2" strips to total 400 inches for outer border
- B) 1 1/2" strips to total 340 inches for inner and middle borders
- C) 1 1/8" strips to total 340 inches for inner and middle borders

Sew 2" strips.

A) Using the 2" strips cut in Step 1, sew two light/background and two dark/medium strips together as shown below. They do not need to be the same length. Press to dark.

B) Cut the strip unit into 2" wide sections. (Sections should measure 2" x 6 1/2".) If you cut some 2" squares you can use them on sections that do not have 4 pieces in them. If needed, cut more 2" strips. You will need 396 sections.
