"The Care and Feeding of a Fabric Stash" explains fabrics such as poison greens to indigos, shirtings, and chintzes. 

Here are the instructions for the first block of the quilt we are making this year. We will do the second block in March and in April we will tell you how to put it together. Pick the size you want to make.



Just Squares Block

Read all instructions before you begin



Block Size	A - Cut 5 Dark	B - Cut 8 Dark (may be strip pieced)	C- Cut 4 Light
6"	2 1/2" sq	1 1/2" sq	2 1/2" x 1 1/2"
9 "	3 1/2" sq	2" x 2"	3 1/2" x 2"



Quilt Size	Block Size	Blocks Required
Table Topper 35" x 35"	9"	5
Table Runner 23" x 47"	6"	11
Throw 56" x 74"	9"	18
Full/Queen 77" x 95"	9"	32

- · Select your project- pictures and fabric requirements are in February newsletter.
- Cut the required pieces for Just Squares Block see table. For total number of each sized piece, Multiply required blocks by the A-B-C pieces per block.
- The B pieces can be strip pieced (1 1/2" strips for 6" block or 2" strips for 9" block) and then cut to 1 1/2" X 2 1/2" for 6" blocks or 2" X 3 1/2" for 9" blocks. Four needed for each block
- · Sew the 2-B pieces to C to make B/C unit- 4 needed
- Refer to the picture to complete the block
- Remember to turn the B/C unit so the light fabric to outside of block and not to center. Ripping is not FUN
- Make the required number of blocks for your project
