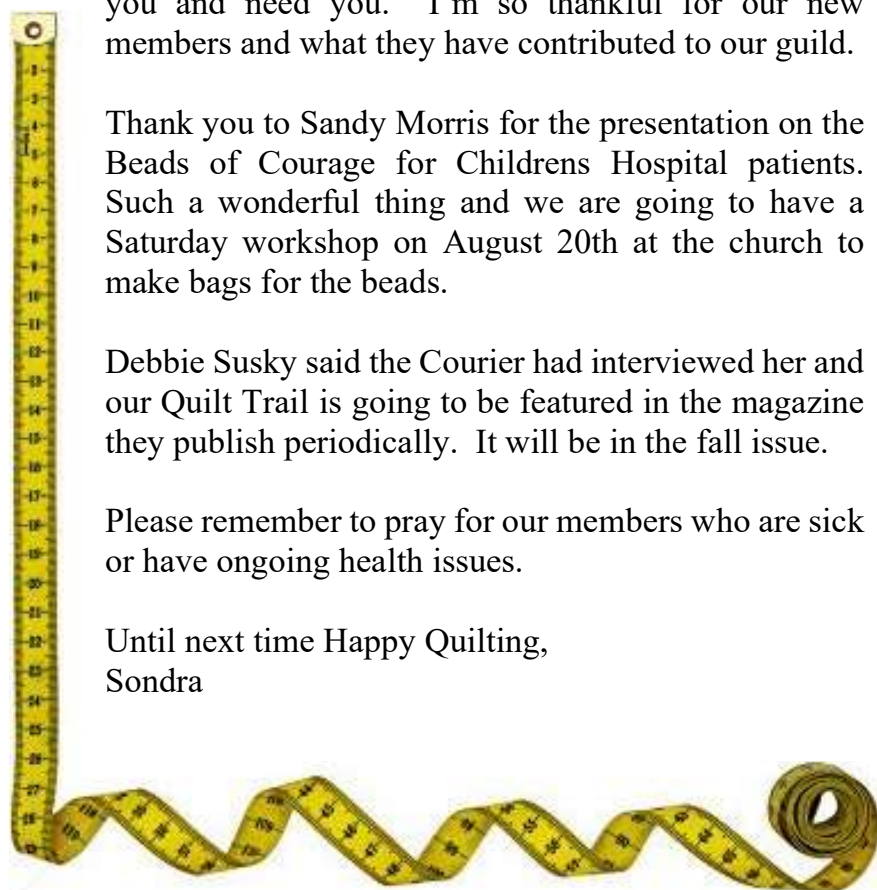

~ Meeting Minutes ~ July 18, 2022

5:30 Workshop

Trading patches 6" square exchange – Pat Wade
Our exchange began tonight with 24 participating. Current expectation is that we will bring 24 6" squares to exchange for 6 months, probably end in January skipping December due to Christmas party. Jane Hammonds quilt from the same type exchange some years ago was displayed. Pat has a couple of different block patterns to show next month as alternatives.

A tip shared was to make a guide for your 6" square ruler to make the diagonal. Use cardboard or cardstock to make a 1" guide, draw a center line, then 1/2" to the left and right of it draw two more lines. Use a piece of double-sided tape on the diagonal line on your ruler, line up the line on the ruler with the center line on your cardstock guide and press the ruler to the guide. Trim off the ends of the guide. This guide will make squaring up your blocks easier. Instructions for the guide are included with the pattern that was distributed as well.

Saturday Workshops –

August 20 – Sandi Morris Bag for Beads of Courage – Arkansas Children's Hospital gives patients glass beads of courage for each procedure that is done. There is a program for making bags for these beads, kits come with 50 labels and bag instructions. The bags need 2 pieces of coordinating fabric (outside and lining) 9" X 12" and 2 – 26" cord. More information can be found at Beadsofcourage.org. Plan to come 8/20 to the church, 9:30 am, bring fabric, sewing machine and supplies and we will see how many bags we can make! Sack lunch.

October 1 - Pat Wade - Raw Edge Applique –

Class will teach how to raw edge applique a wall hanging with 3 Santas for Christmas decorating. The cost of the class is \$5 and Pat will provide kits for the applique pieces for \$5. You will need to provide your own background fabric 22" X 19" and some scraps to practice on. Since this project will require a lot of pressing, if you have small iron and board you may want to bring. Sack lunch. Let Pat know if you intend to participate as she will not cut up fabric for your kit unless you commit.

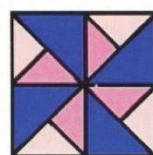
Homemade version of Best Press Spray

Makes 27 oz: 24 oz distilled water & 3 oz vodka
Make 9 oz: 8 oz distilled water & 1 oz vodka
Mix and put in spray container. Recycle a hair spray pump container that sprays a very fine mist.

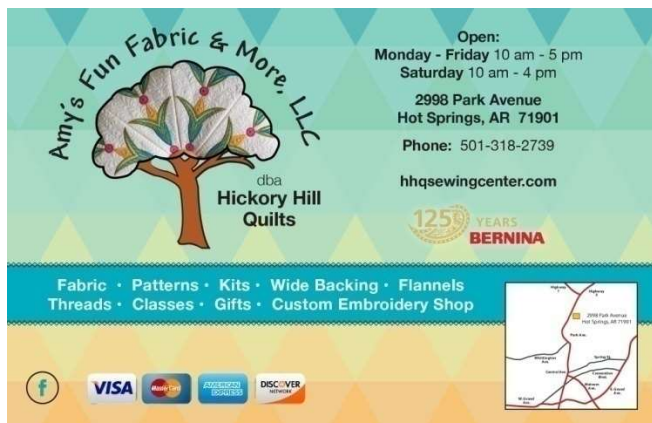
