### ~ Tips for Row Quilts ~

Several years ago, Jean Corley introduced us to a scrappy row quilt and then oversaw a 5:30 workshop. To date, she has made 10 so I asked her for some pointers.

- Vary the height size of each row. If all the blocks finish at 2" in one row, make the blocks finish at 4" in the next row, etc.
- Put a strip of fabric between each row to set it off. You can audition fabric to see what makes that row stand out.
- Finish all the rows before you put it together so that you can move them if needed.
- When assembling the quilt, line up the edges of each row on only one side and stitch together. Then trim the other side to make it straight.
- Jean tries to make her quilts about 45" x 55" and then adds about a 5" border. This will make the completed quilt about 50" x 60".
- To add interest, make the border a pieced border. Use 9-patches, piano keys or flying geese, etc.
- Finish off the quilt with a double binding. Jean favors a black with white dots or stripes for the outer binding and a red fabric for the inner binding.

There's really no wrong way to make a row quilt. This is a great opportunity to try your hand at a new block without committing to a whole quilt using that block. You don't have to make horizontal rows. Make them vertical! You don't have to make a large quilt. Make a wall hanging! It's an opportunity to use up some of your scraps. However, you do not have to make it a scrappy quilt. Jerri Puska has researched dozens of ideas for rows in a quilt.

#### 5:30 Workshop:

## **Un-Paper Towels – Sondra Curtis**

Sondra provided information about the number of trees and water required to generate the paper towels we use as a country. To be green, there is a movement to make and reuse your own Un-Paper towels. She provided the instructions and samples of the creation process of towels she has/is making for herself out of flannel and quilters' cotton. Note: flannel must be washed so it will shrink and the grain on each fabric needs to be matched when sewing the two fabrics together.

#### **Row Quilts – Gwen Rogers**

Interest in the guild doing a row quilt has been expressed and several row quilts were displayed for viewing and discussion. Gwen remembered Jean Corley leading a row quilt many years ago and spoke with her to get some tips as we plan our row quilt, a handout of Jean's tips was provided. A couple of items noted: each row does not need to be the same height, differences will create interest and size is up to you, a row quilt can be a large quilt, small quilt or wall hanging. Jerri Puska had been planning some seasonal row quilts for herself and shared a spreadsheet of block ideas. We would like to have a row block demoed each month as part of the 5:30 workshop and are going to plan Saturday sew days to work on them. It would be great to have volunteers pick a block to demo, a signup sheet was distributed.

#### **Guild Meeting Minutes -**

#### Secretary's Minutes from prior meeting

Minutes from the April meeting were approved as written.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Pat Wade – Treasurer's report will be distributed with the newsletter. It was noted that we have \$710 that is trip money for the Missouri Star trip that was cancelled, 3 are members and 3 are non-members. Discussed refund of the money, especially to non-members. Collectively, the guild would still like to have a bus trip to Missouri Star.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Professional Workshops** – Cheri Johnson - No report.

SCQG BOM - Cheri Johnson - In July each year we have had a patriotic block auction, in the last few years the number of blocks submitted for the auction have dwindled. This year we are going to change our angle, utilizing the BOM process. Saline County has two Quilts of Valor groups and more veterans than the groups can support. Cheri has volunteered to have a BOM that will be a 12 ½" patriotic block, utilizing a white or off-white background. Each month the blocks will be split and donated to the two QOV groups in Saline County to help them generate more quilts. For each block you submit, you will have a ticket entered for the monthly raffle, a \$10 gift certificate to the local quilt shops. This month Cheri has made kits, she will continue to try to make kits when possible. If you have patriotic fabric to donate to this cause, please provide it to Cheri.

### Saturday Workshops – Jerri Puska & Judy Anderson

Due to graduations, May will not have a Saturday Workshop. Jerri will get with the church to schedule the Saturdays for the rest of the year. We will cancel or have an open sew day, as needed. Will attempt to schedule as the Saturday after the monthly meeting. The following items have been donated to have in our closet at Calvary for use with our sew days: two sets of riser legs for tables, pressing board, cutting board, and an iron.

#### **New Business**

#### <u>Monthly Program - Laura Todd The Quilted</u> Chicken

Laura Todd of the Quilted Chicken talked about her quilt shop in the big yellow house on Hwy. 5. Her online store and some plans for the new fabrics that are coming out. She highlighted a couple of fabric lines that have causes they support with a portion of the proceeds of their fabric lines. As she stated, "Quilters are going to buy fabric anyhow, why not support a cause with our purchases?"

One of the topics of discussion was the difference between the choices of color of Laura and her mother. She displayed several small quilts that were two sided with different color combinations to provide double duty while requiring storage just for one item.

When completing a quilting job to finish an old quilt top that had been discovered, Laura realized that while she did not like the color choices the pattern was very visually appealing yet was really a simple quilt block. Her idea continued to blossom, she chose a different color scheme and created the same quilt pattern with a totally different vibe! Check out the pictures posted on our Facebook page; it is the quilt with vertical wide stripes of solid colors interspersed with pieced blocks on the diagonal.

## Stack Um Up.....

Pick 6 of your UFO's that you want to complete and list them on UFO form. If you do not have 6 projects just list what you have. Turn in your form along with a \$1.00 fee for each of your projects to the UFO chairperson, Judy Johnson. Please make a copy for yourself. A UFO must be at least 6 months old and something you have not worked on in the last 3 months. You may also enter 2 kits as long as you have had them for 6 months or more.

### Roll Um Out...

In May we will roll the dice to determine what project we will be working on first.

Note: number 6 will not be included in the dice roll, it will be the last project completed so if you have a big project put that as number six. Example: if in June we roll number 4, your project that is numbered 4 is the one that will be due in July.

- The number drawn in June will be due at the August meeting.
- The number drawn in August will be due at the October meeting
- The number drawn in October will be due at the December meeting
- The number drawn in December will be due at the February meeting

- The number drawn in February will be due at the April meeting
- The number six will be due at the June 2023 meeting

#### Get Um Done...

Bring your completed project on or before the designated month's meeting and register it with the UFO chairperson, Judy Johnson. If you cannot be at the meeting send a picture to Judy by email or text on or before the meeting date. When your quilt is registered you receive ticket/tickets to enter your name in a drawing for prizes. . .

- 1 ticket if only top completed no more work to be done on top
- 1 ticket if top from the previous drawing is completed (Quilted and bound) in the two additional months since it was due.
- 3 tickets if project is complete-Quilted and bound

The only reason we are allowing quilt tops is because sometimes the person doing the machine quilting can't get it done right away.
