Disappearing 9 patch – Lisa Shulte

Lisa provided the pattern with instructions, a card stock demo block and a completed block. It is a very interesting block with a couple of sashing options. It does appear to require marking of the block corners as the block is cut apart and restitched together after turning the direction of some of the blocks. Instructions provided with the newsletter. Lisa also provided some needle threaders; she has been looking for a better one and bought a different design for us all to try.

Row Quilt block – Shirley Miller

Shirley has been busy with row quilt blocks! She displayed a row of owls – they were adorable! A row of sail boats and then ice cream cones – talked about how much fun she was having with these blocks. She provided the attached instructions of how to build the ice cream cone and any other row quilt block you like.

Professional Workshops – Cheri Johnson - No report

SCOG Patriotic BOM - Cheri Johnson - For the first month of our Patriotic BOM, we had 92 blocks turned in for the month! The two Saline County Quilt of Valor groups will receive 46 blocks each. Thank you all for your participation. Karen Mitchell expressed thanks on behalf of the QOV groups, as this effort will help them produce many more quilts. Cheri handed out kits for next month, it will be the same block, the friendship star. In the drawing, Karen Mitchell and Pat Wade were the winners of the \$10 quilt shop gift certificates. Cheri expressed appreciation for the support of the Saline County quilt shops in donation of these gift certificates for this patriotic BOM challenge to support QOV in Saline County.

Saturday Workshops – Jerri Puska & Judy Anderson - Met with Diane (Secretary – Calvary Baptist) to schedule Saturday workshops. June is out, there is a conflict on each 4th Saturday, a men's Breakfast is held. She is going to let me know when they usually finish up as they start early and might be done by mid-morning. The church also provides a meeting place for home school groups, this is usually Tuesdays during the school year, but they also have some parent meetings that occur other times. The home school group provides the church with their school calendar by the end of July, at that time I will attempt to schedule some other dates.

Myrna were the event crew. Had a space under the pavilion; traffic was not as good as we hoped, but we did sell some tickets and items. Based upon these events, we are generating more income with the items than we are tickets. The hot item this past Saturday was these cute card holders, selling one for \$6 or 2 for \$10. (Myrna provided a display) We need to make some more! Cheri Johnson will try to get the pattern to distribute. We will be considering utilizing some of the Saturday workshop/Sew Days to make various items for our event sales. If you have an idea for a different item, please let us know.




Ice Cream Cone


- Fusible: Trace pattern on smooth side of the fusible. If pattern is not reversed then turn pattern over and trace. Cut out about ¼th inch larger than pattern piece.
- Fabric: Choose a fabric for each piece of the fusible. Turn fabric to the wrong side and iron the rough side of the fusible to the fabric, then cut piece out on the line. Get all fabric pieces cut out before you fuse to the background piece.
- Background: When pieces are ready to be fused to the background piece, take the backing of the fusible off of the fabric and place the pieces where you want them on the background. Iron the pieces for at least 6-10 seconds to be sure they are fused and won't come off.
- Stitching: Either machine or hand buttonhole stitch your block pieces the way you want them to look. Have Fun!

Double Disappearing Nine Patch Chaos

Step 1: Select 9 fat quarters or layer cake squares or any size of your choice. Square them up If necessary. Sew 3 pieces together and make 3 rows. Then, sew the three rows together.







Cut block in half vertically and horizontally to make 4 smaller blocks. Label the corner of each block as shown (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A).

> Next, cut each of the small blocks in half vertically and horizontally. Then, label as shown. Pay close attention to the direction of labeling (mirror images). Label all 4 blocks as 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D, etc.

Now, sew rows together as shown. Note, some blocks need to be flipped upside down for proper placement in the design.

Black sashing may be added to create a stained glass window look.
