#### ~ Patriotic Block Drive ~

Thank you for your great support of the patriotic block drive. We will continue this through November. For the past 2 months we have made friendship star blocks and we are grateful for the work Cheri and Ola have done to create kits for this block. At our meeting in July Debbie brought kits for a new block design. (Thank you, Debbie!) If you were not able to get a kit, please follow the instructions in the pattern in this newsletter below. #### ~ Star Ornaments ~

Pick 3 coordinating Christmas fabrics.

Cut into squares – samples used 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and 3". They can be made bigger or smaller.

Brenda cut them with a pinking shear rotary blade bought on Amazon or you could use pinking shears.

Fold each square of fabric on the diagonal.

Stack in a star shape. May take a minute or two to get it right. Pin in the center.

Sew a button in the center to hold the layer together.

At the top where the star point meet, fold the ribbon to make a hanger and sew the end between the points of the star.

If you desire the star to have more structure, either spray the squares with spray starch or use a heat n bond stabilizer.

Row quilt Strips – Gwen Rogers

Several strips made from scraps were displayed of various heights that can be added to row quilts. A row quilt can have rows of any size you want.

Inversion Quilt blocks – use a 10" layer cake and make whatever size block you want.

Maine trip row quilt – LuAnn Baker

Luann bought fabric on a trip to Maine and is using it in her row quilt. She displayed 3 rows of blocks completed so far: one highlighting light houses, one with ships, and one with crabs.

## 12 1/2" Nine Patches and Focal Squares



The pieces are oversized so they can be trimmed to size.

Background Fabric – Cut 2 ½" strips Cut one strip approximately 11" long Cut two strips approximately 6" long

Red Fabric – Cut 2 ½" strips Cut one strip approximately 11" long Cut one strip approximately 6" long


Blue Fabric- Cut 2 ½ strips Cut one strip approximately 11" long

Focal Fabric – Cut two 6 ½" squares

Make a strip set of 11" red + 11" white + 11" blue. Cut into four  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " segments.



Make a strip set of 6" white + 6" red + 6" white. Cut into two 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " segments.



Use segments to make nine-patches as shown in picture. Lay out and join squares to form the block as pictured. Finished block should be  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
