5:30 Workshop - No waste flying geese blocks – Sharon Vanover. A handout was provided along with a tutorial of the building of the blocks utilizing a method where 1 large square block and 4 small square blocks will become 4 flying geese block units.

Numerous rows and blocks of row quilts were presented. Flying Geese, Pinwheels, Hearts, boats. The handout was not electronic, the following links are directions available that appear to be very similar.

Professional Workshops – Cheri Johnson - No report.

SCQG Patriotic BOM for Quilts of Valor – Cheri Johnson - We had 71 blocks turned in for the month! The two Saline County Quilt of Valor groups will receive the blocks. Thank you all for your participation. Gift certificate winners this month are Sidney Morris and Pat Wade. The quilt shops of Saline County are donating gift certificates for this patriotic BOM challenge to support QOV in Saline County. Kits for next month's blocks were distributed. Karen, Ola and Cheri displayed several quilts made from the blocks donated by SCQG to be donated in a ceremony later this week at the Benton Municipal building. Two of these will be presented to female veterans who are now serving the community as Benton Police officers.

Saturday Workshops – Jerri Puska & Judy Anderson. Saturday Workshops scheduled: September 23, October 21 - Mark your Calendars!

These Saturday Sew Days will be open to our members and the public with the goal of sharing our craft and knowledge with potential new members who have an interest in quilting. We may also utilize these sew days to create items to sell at the events we attend.

<u>Saline County Fair</u> – Exhibit Hall dates Sept. 7– 9, 2:00 pm – 8:00 pm. We will have a table with the donation quilt displayed and sell tickets for the quilt. Cannot sell any other items as there is not enough room for people to shop. Will need volunteers to work 2 hour or more increments to man our table. Please contact Myrna.

If you would like to enter items into the fair, google "Saline County Fair AR 2023" or go to <u>Https://Saline.fairwire.com</u> Note: there are specific quilt categories and you are only allowed to enter 1 quilt per category. Quilt Blocks may also be entered. Items must never have been entered before and must have been completed since the last county fair. **2024 Nominating Committee** has been appointed by President, as follows: Myrna Yandell, Pat Wade, Barbie Small, Judy Huggins, Cheri Johnson, and Sharon Vanover.

Announcements:

The Hope Quilt Show will be October 13 & 14, 9:30 - 4:00 at the College in Hope, Hampstead Hall. Free and they usually have great vendors.

Program – Hickory Hills Quilt Shop, Amy Hoyt and Barbara. A pop-up shop was set up where Amy displayed some of the new items she saw at the Kansas City quilt show. She displayed the hickory nut template that is patented by the Hickory Hill shop and spoke about the shop's inspire day, the 1st Wednesday of each month. Currently, there are about 90 attending the inspire days, with 3 time slots: 10:30, 1:00, and 3:30, must register to attend. Join their Facebook page to see the pics from the inspire day each month. They also have Bag Days several times a year where anything that will fit into the bag is 25% off that day. At the first of the year, the bags are sold, then throughout the year there are discount bag days.

Faultless has a new product for starching your fabric, it is lighter than best press and less expensive. Amy discussed several starching products: the new Faultless product, Best Press, and Terial Magic with examples of fabric sprayed with each to compare. This led to a discussion about whether spraying your fabric with one of these products would make it not shrink when pressed with the iron. All fabric shrinks, it is just a matter of how much prior preparation of the fabric has been done on the gray goods. For example: a special print might be the same in the quilt shop and one of the big box stores, because they were all bought from the same manufacturer. But the other fabrics, the gray goods, will differ in how they have been processed, so the degree of shrinkage will differ. Your quilt shop fabrics are of a higher quality and will have less shrinkage than your big box store fabrics, and they will cost you more. All fabric will ALL shrink some, so it is highly

recommended that all be washed and dried to eliminate the shrinkage.

The Hickory Hills shop has a large amount of fabric, it might have been 9000 yards; it was a large number. The Bypass to highway 7 will be opening within the next few weeks, the shop is half way between the highway 5 & 7 roundabout and Gulpha Gorge on highway 7.
