#### 5:30 Workshop

Patriot Row quilt odds and ends – Jerri Puska The Patriot Row Quilt so far has rows of hot air balloons, flying geese, hearts, and sail boats. The hot air balloons pattern was modified to use a solid piece of fabric to showcase the patriot prints rather than all be striped. This was Jerri's first attempt at flying geese and she used the method Sharon had demonstrated last month. Not having a flying geese trimming ruler, Jerri borrowed one. A poll at the meeting indicated most of the quilters who have them use the winged trimmer.

At last month's meeting, Amy from Hickory Hills showed a product called "Grippey" that is a spray for the backside of the rulers to help them not slide on the fabric when cutting. Jerri bought a can and has sprayed several of her rulers, this product works. It is easy to apply and dries quickly, recommend spraying outside when it is not 90 degrees or over.

- East End Craft Day last Saturday Attended Five quild members took our raffle quilt and items to the East End Craft Day. It was a successful day generating \$157, with \$54 raffle tickets.
- Saline County Fair results We had our best year ever at the county fair! All of the helpers were outstanding, and we sold out of tickets by 6:30 on Saturday evening, selling over \$500 of tickets. In addition, we entered some of our charity quilts and quilts of valor into the quilt judging. We took home 3 best of show and numerous blue ribbons, generating over \$60 of income to the guild. More tickets are on order.
- Old Fashion Day, October 14<sup>th</sup>, Benton. Old Fashion Day is a major fundraiser for our guild. The raffle quilt is given away at the end of the event. We need helpers to work 2-hour shifts or more throughout the day. That morning we need 2 extra helpers at 8:15 am to help set up the canopy. It would be great to have someone who is familiar with canopies. A sign -p sheet will be sent around for sign up.

# **Program – Quilts of Valor – Karen Mitchell with Sandy Morris**

Karen is a member of 4 EHC Clubs but has found her passion in Quilts of Valor. She has been involved with Quilts of Valor for 5 years and is a member of the Johnston's Home Center QOV group.

The QOV BOM by SCQG have been an enormous benefit to both of the Saline county QOV groups. Our member Debbie Susky is a member of the other group, Let Freedom Ring. This infusion of blocks from our group have helped the two clubs be able to generate a much higher volume of quilts. Karen spoke about the QOV presenting ceremonies which include a flag ceremony provided by the American Heritage Girls group in Saline County and the reading of a poem. Sometimes they have a singer who sings "Amazing Grace". ceremonies occur wherever needed, at homes, hospitals, or a big group at VFW, 20 quilts were presented at the VFW. These ceremonies are very emotional and most of the recipients shed some tears. All quilts are labeled with a presentation label that includes the recipient and their service information.

The QOV was founded in 2003 by Katherine Roberts whose son was deployed to Iran. Over 357,000 quilts have been awarded to date. Shelia Gordon is the QOV State Coordinator. Anyone can nominate a veteran online, if a QOV group is not near the recipient, groups nearby are asked to provide a quilt. The JHC QOV group has presented quilts to several in the Mena area where there is not a group.

The table at the County Fair representing QOV was successful receiving over \$400 in donations.


