Charity Quilts – Sidney Morris - Congratulations SCQG – 106 Charity Quilts have been distributed this year so far, 7 will be given to Cooper Anthony tonight and we have 12 designated for AR Children's Hospital. Three needing binding were handed out to members.

If you need fabric for donation quilt, contact Sidney and she will meet you at the studio on Alcoa. Regular sew days are the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Thursdays, and the last Saturday of the month, meeting around 9:30. **Beads of Courage** – Sandy Morris - Sandy has some Beads of Courage kits and labels for those needing labels for bags they have made. AR Children's Hospital gives colored beads to patients for each procedure they have done. One of the donation items requested by AR Children's Hospital, is bags to hold the beads collected by the patients.

2022 UFO Challenge – Judy Johnson - Item #2 is due tonight, and the #1 will be due in December. If you need to know what you submitted for your #1, contact Judy. Info about the annual UFO challenge: select 6 projects that you have not worked on in the last 3 months, number them 1 - 6with 6 being the largest/most difficult project and submit your form. Judy will track your projects and their associated UFO #. For each UFO completed, you will receive an entry for the drawing at the end of the challenge.

Since becoming a member, LuAnn has been very active in the guild and wants to be more involved. The committee recommends that the years requirement be waived to allow her to hold the office of 2^{nd} Vice President.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the officers nominated and allow the waiver of the guild membership years requirement on behalf of LuAnn Baker. Motion Passed.

<u>New Business</u> No new Business

Program – Cooper Anthony – Elisha Morrison Cooper Anthony is an organization serving abused children ages 3-18, cognitively delayed adults and 2 years old if verbal, with two offices, Hot Springs and Benton, with clients from the following Arkansas counties: Garland, Grant, Hot Springs County, Saline & Polk. Last year 833 cases were handled by these two offices, with 350 cases being Saline County alone. Some very sad statistics: the average age of sexual abuse is 9 years old, most children never tell, the majority of those reported are by accidental disclosure. The statistics do not support the 'Stranger Danger' theory; in 93% of the cases, it is someone the child knows, 81% of the time it is someone in their home and 70% of the time there is more than one type of abuse.

Cooper Anthony was founded to provide a single contact point/advocate for potentially abused children after the realization that the process was so fragmented with multiple organizations requiring the children to repeat their story over and over; the children were traumatized by the people who were attempting to help them. With Cooper Anthony involved there is a central point that provides information to all parties while putting the child's needs first. Everything in the Cooper Anthony process is designed to make the child feel comfortable and safe, the design of their office/room areas and the people who work directly with the children. Cooper Anthony's #1 focus is to make the children feel safe, not scared, and believe they will be ok, capable of making friends, functioning and fitting in with other children. Tours of the facility are available. The community provides support through numerous activities, including the quilts provided by SCQG for the children.

The charity quilts provided by SCQG are given to the children as a comfort blanket. Each child gets to see the quilts available and choose the one for them. It is a gift and theirs to keep with them while going through the whole process.

There are still authoritative agencies that do not work with Cooper Anthony, please share the information about Cooper Anthony and their mission. Anyone can request Cooper Anthony be involved if any abuse has been reported to be investigated. Even with the number of cases handled last year, those are only a fraction of the number of cases reported. Cooper Anthony also has educational specialists on staff to work with families to help them. See you next month, Jerri Puska, SCQG Secretary
