

**Salted Caramel Dark Chocolate Chunk Cookies**

2 sticks softened butter

3/4 Cup granulated sugar

1 Cup packed light brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 1/2 Tablespoons pure vanilla

1/4 Cup burnt caramel sauce (you can use any caramel sauce here, like Smuckers)

3 3/4 Cup all purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda

12 oz bag mini chocolate chips

1 1/2 Cups chopped good quality chocolate

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a stand or electric mixer, beat the butter and sugars until well combined. Beat in the eggs and vanilla, and swirl in the caramel sauce until well combined.

2. Place the flour, salt and baking soda into a large bowl and mix. Slowly add to wet ingredients then add the chocolate chips. Save chunks for later.

3. Place a 1/4 cup scoop of cookie dough into muffin top cups. Press down, then sprinkle with a pinch or two of sea salt then press the chocolate chunks over top. Bake for 12-15 minutes or until just golden around edges. Remove and let cool for 5 minutes before transferring to a cooling rack.

Makes 18 Large cookies



### Pat's Book Review

Quilter's Academy Vol. 2 --Sophomore Year by Harriet Hargrave and Carrie Hargrave.

This is the 2nd in a series of 6 books and is new at the Saline County Library. Quilter's Academy Vol. 2 is a basic introduction to the art of quilting. The authors start at the very beginning, with the selection of supplies for quilting, and discuss everything beginners need to know about fabric preparation, cutting, piecing, basting, quilting, and finishing. There are 9 classes with easy-to-follow lessons and hands-on exercises.

The book also covers everything from maintaining your tools and cleaning your machines, lighting needs, to how to calculate the finished size of your designs. This is definitely a learning tool and not a design inspiration, I would recommend this to all beginners and for more experienced quilters the section on Designing with internal frames is very inspiring.

This book can be checked out at the Saline County Library.
