The photos show those warm rich colors and some of the funky oranges and mustard yellows used during this period. This is a great book for the beginner AND accomplished quilters. Cranberry Salad

- 1 6 oz box of sugarless raspberry Jello
- 1 16 oz whole cranberries
- 2 cups boiling water
- 20 oz can crushed pineapple, use juice, too
- 1 cup chopped celery (I use 2 ribs)
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Dissolve Jello in boiling water. Stir well to dissolve. Then add cranberries, pineapple and juice. Then add celery and pecans. Pour into a 9 x 13 dish, and refrigerate. Makes 15 servings.

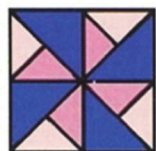
